 1611 Anne Meade of Henham in the County of Essex widow being weak in
 body yett of perfect memory thanks be to almighty god remembering & falling to mind
 the vncertainty of this transitory life doe make & ordeyne this my last will & testament
 in maner & forme following ffirst & principally I bequeath my soule to almighty god
 my deathe hoping & most steadfastly trusting thorough the merits of Iesus Christ
 my onely Saviour & Redeemer to have full fruition of that eternall & immortall Kingdom
 which he hath prepared for the elect my body I comend unto the earth to be buryed in Christian
 buryall in such place as mine Exors & Adors hereafter named shall thinke fitt I will
 touching such goods as the lord hath lent me I give & dispose in maner & forme following
 ffirst I give & bequeath unto George Woodland my sonne & to his heires for ever
 all that my messuage or tenement with the yards gardenes porchard & therunto
 belonging with the appurtenances together with a parcel of land adjoining to the
 said messuage now in the occupation of the said George situate lying and
 being in Kyttling in the said County of Essex Item I give & bequeath unto
 the said George my sonne the summe of six poundes of lawful money of
 England to be paid unto him by my Exors & Adors hereafter named within
 six monethes after my deathe Item I give & bequeath unto my child
 of the said George Woodland my sonne the summe of twenty shillings a
 year to be paid att their severall ages of one & twenty yeares by mine Exors
 hereafter named And if any of the children of the said George shall
 happen to dye before they shall accomplish the age of one & twenty yeares then that
 to be equally divided between them Item I give & bequeath unto Anne
 Woodland my grandchild att her age of one & twenty yeares one feather bed
 one paire of sheets two pillowes two pillowcases & three powder dishes of
 the middle sort Item I give & bequeath unto the said George Woodland my
 sonne one holland sheet & three powder dishes wch he hath in his custody already
 and also my trundle bed one bolster one coverlett and blanket four paire
 of sheets one table cloth halfe a dozen of napkins my two middle & small
 two stillitts my long table in the hall & my dubbord standing in the place
 three chests two barrells one tubb the same to be delivred unto the said
 George by my Exors within one month after my deathe And I doe
 make & ordeyne Nicholas Meade my sonne sole Exors & Adors
 this my last will & testament And thus testifying all former
 wills by me made I doe pronounce this to be my last will and
 testament In witness whereof I have hereunto sett my hand
 & seale the day & yeare first above written
