In the Name of God Amen the eighth day of May in the one & Twentieth year
of the Reigne of our Sovereign Lord Charles the Second of England Scotland
Ireland King Defender of the faith of Anno Dom 1669. I Thomas
Barber of Honham in the County of Essex husbandman being sick of body yett
of perfect minde and memorye prayes to unto Almighty God for the same
yet knowing that my tyme here upon Earth is but short and my life uncerteine
I do therefore hereby make publish & declare this to be my last will and
testament Revoking all other wills by me formerly made Injunct
I give & bequeath my soule into the hands of Almighty God my maker
Saviour & Redeemer And my body I commit to the earth from whence it was
taken to be buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named
I give & bequeath unto Henry Barber my sonne the sum of Twenty
shillings of lawfull money of England to be payed unto him by my Executors
hereafter named within one month next after my decease being lawfully
demanded, I give & bequeath unto Ellen the wife of Thomas Hoxin
of Honham aforesaid my daughter All that my freehold Messuages or
Commonhold situate in Honham aforesaid with all the yards gardenes
orchard & buildings whatt soever therein unto belonging and now
in the occupation of Alexander Exams or of his Executors to be and
remain to the proper use & behoofe of the said Ellen Hoxin my daughter
for during the term of her naturall life And after her decease to be
remaine to the proper use & behoofe of Henry Hoxin my grandchild
sonne of the said Ellen my daughter and of his heirs & Assignes forever
I give & bequeath unto Thomas Hoxin my grandchild sonne
of the said Ellen my daughter and of his heirs & Assignes forever
all that freehold messuages or tenements whatt soever standing in the
chamber over the Hall to be delivered unto him
within one month next after the decease of Ellen my daughter being
lawfully demanded I give & bequeath unto Mary Hoxin my
grandchild my long shot standing in the chamber over the Hall and
one brass pot to be delivered unto her by my Executors when she
shall accomplish the age of one & twenty years being lawfully demanded
I give & bequeath unto Henry Barber my sonne my great beamle
hanging in the kitchen to be delivered unto him by my Executors within
one month next after my decease being lawfully demanded, All the
rest of my movable goods & chattells whatsoever not before bequeathed
I give & bequeath them all unto Ellen Hoxin my daughter towards
the payment of my debts & Legacies of funeral charges And I do
hereby make & ordaine the said Ellen Hoxin my daughter sole Executor
of this my last will & testament In witness whereof I have here
unto putt my hand & seale the day & yeres first above written
