 perfect mind & memory prayes to vnto Almighty God for the same yett knowing that my
 tyme here on earth is but short and my life vncertaine I doe therefore hereby make publicke & declare
 this to be my last will & Testament in manner & forme following I give & bequeath
 my soules into the hands of Almighty God my Malice & enuie I doo forsake & commend
 to the earth from whence it was taken and to be buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter
 named I give & bequeath vnto Matthew Woolley my sonne of Bishop Stortford in the County
 of Hertford gent and to his heires & Assignes for ever All those my ffrees & Copyhold Landes whome
 heires or Assignes doe I shall well & truly paye or cause to be payd vnto my sonne John Woolley
 the full summe of Three hundred of Lawfull Money of England within one quarter of a years
 next after my decease being lawfully demanded by him the said John Woolley at or within my now
 dwelling house situate in Honham aforesaid And also the summe of Three hundred of
 Lawfull Money of England ouery Three monthes next after the aforesaid quarter of a years
 for & during the Term of the naturall life of the said John Woolley my sonne being lawfully
 demanded as aforesaid And if it shall happen that the said Matthew Woolley my sonne his heires
 or Assignes shall or doe refuse to paye the said summe of Three hundred of Lawfull money of England
 vnto the said John Woolley my sonne ouery three monthes as aforesaid for & during the Term of his
 naturall life then I doe hereby give and bequeath all those my ffrees & Copyhold Landes before
 bequeathed vnto Matthew Woolley shall be & remaine to the proper use & vse of John Woolley my sonne
 & of his heires & Assignes I give & bequeath vnto Mrs Ann Woolley the wife of Matthew
 Woolley my sonne my foynd Bodde with the furniture standing in the Chamber to be deliuered vnto
 her by my Executors within one week next after my decease I give & bequeath vnto John Woolley
 my sonne the summe of Ten hundred of Lawfull Money of England to be payd vnto him by Mary
 Woolley my daughter within Three monthes next after my decease being lawfully demanded I give
 & bequeath vnto Anne the wife of Timothy Clarke my daughter the summe of Twenty hundred
 of Lawfull Money of England to be payd vnto her by Mary Woolley my daughter within six monthes
 next after my decease being lawfully demanded I give & bequeath vnto John Woolley my sonne
 the said & the furniture whereon he now lyeth & two payres of sheets to be deliuered vnto
 him within one week next after my decease I give & bequeath vnto Mary Woolley my
 daughter all my moveable goods & Chattels Bills Bonds Mortgages & Surrenders & ready money
 that I shall haue at the tyme of my decease not before by me bequeathed to be deliuered vnto
 her by my Executors within six monthes next after my decease I give & bequeath vnto
 Martha Baron & Mary Baron my seruaunts the summe of Twenty shillings a peere to be payd
 vnto them by my Executors within one month next after my decease And I doe hereby make
 & ordaine Matthew Woolley my sonne sole Executor of this my last will & Testament And
 I doe witness whereof I the said Matthew Woolley sonne haue caused this my will to be written
 & haue here vnto sett my hand & Seale the day & yeare first abovesayd
