Beddy but of perfect mind and memory please be unto Almighty God for the same yet knowing that my time here
upon earth is but short and my life uncertain I do therefore hereby make publish and declare this to be my last will
& Testament Revoking all other wills by me formerly Made first and principally I give & bequeath my soul into the
hands of Almighty God my Maker Saviour and Redeemer And my body I bequeath to the earth from whence it was taken and to
be buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named whose name it shall please God to call me And as for my worldly
Estate which it hath pleased Almighty God to lend me I do hereby dispose of it as followeth Item I give and bequeath unto
Margaret my well beloved wife All that my household stuff and furniture in Honham aforesaid whosoever
now I own with all the yards gardens cut hedges and buildings thereto belonging for and during the Term of her
natural life upon condition that the said Margaret my wife do keep the said household stuff and furniture
with sufficient repairs And moderately after her decease to be and remains to the proper use & behoof of George
Munk my son and of his heirs and Assigns forever Item I give and bequeath unto the said Margaret my wife
All that my poor or small of arable Land lying in Howford for and during the Term of her natural life And after
her decease to be & remains to the proper use & behoof of George Munk my son and to his heirs Assigns forever
Item I give and bequeath unto the said Margaret my wife All that my poor or small of Customary Land lying in
Weymouth aforesaid to be and remains to the proper use and behoof of the said Margaret my wife and to her
heirs and Assigns forever upon condition that the said Margaret my wife do not truly give and discharge all
my debts & Charges of funeral charge Item I give and bequeath unto Margaret my wife All that my free
hold Messuages or Tenements situate in Honham aforesaid which I purchased of Richard Chamberlain to have
the yards garden orchard & buildings thereto belonging for and during the Term of her natural life upon
condition that the said Margaret my wife or her Assigns do maintain & keep the said Tenement and
buildings in sufficient repairs And also not to lop or cut any of the trees & wood standing in the orchard
with or without down cut down or strike any other tree or wood during the Term of her natural life
that standeth upon any part of the premises belonging to the said Messuages but shall preserve and keep them
as well as possible for as they run from any hurt or spoils thereof And undisturbedly after her decease my will and
mind is that the said household Messuages yards garden & orchard & buildings with Chattiments shall
be and remains to the proper use and behoof of Ann Munk my daughter and to the heirs lawfully to
be begotten of her Beddy forever And for want of such issue to be and remains to the proper use and
use of the heirs of me the said Thomas Munk forever Item I give and bequeath unto Sarah
Munk and Susanna Munk my daughters the full sum of five hundred a year of good and lawful
Money of England to be paid unto them the said Sarah Munk & Susanna Munk my daughters with
in one whole year next after the decease of Margaret my wife By her heirs Executors or Assigns
And if in case the said sum of five hundred a year shall not be well & truly paid by the heirs Executors
or Assigns of the said Margaret my wife as aforesaid I bequeath then my will and meaning is that the said
poor or small of Customary Land lying in Weymouth aforesaid to be and remains to the proper
use & behoof of the said Margaret my wife & to her heirs & Assigns forever And I bequeath
to the said Sarah Munk & Susanna Munk my daughters of the said heirs and Assigns charging
debts that are owing and due unto me I give and bequeath them all unto Margaret my wife towards
the payment of my debts and the bringing up of my children And I do hereby make and confirm the
said Margaret my wife sole Executrix of this my last will and Testament And I do hereby desire
and make choice of my Loving Brother in Law Joseph Johnson and my Loving Brother Nathaniel
Munk to be supervisors or overseers of this my last will & Testament to see that this my will performed
in all things According to the true meaning thereof In witness whereof I the said Thomas Munk
have hereunto set my hand and Seal the Day & year first above written!

Read Sent and Delivered and Monitored that the said Thomas Munk do hereby give
published to be the last will and bequeath unto Mary Burt my daughter the sum of five
Testament of the said Thomas five shillings of lawful Money of England to be paid unto
Munk in the presence of: her by my Executors when one month next after Thomas Munk
my decease being lawfully demanded!
